Overview of the WAM Pilot Programme

Background and Key Initiatives

- The Legislative Council approved HK\$100 million for the Financial Services & the Treasury Bureau ("FSTB") to implement a three-year pilot programme (2016-2019), which is now extended to 2022/2023, to enhance talent training for the insurance sector and the asset and wealth management (WAM) sector.
- The Hong Kong Securities and Investment ("HKSI") Institute is appointed as the implementation agent.

3 Key Initiatives:

1) Promotion and Education

- To raise the awareness of jobs and career path in the WAM sector;
- To attract students to join the profession upon graduation.

2) Summer Internship Programme ("SIP")

- To provide early exposure to working in the WAM sector;
- To offer wide spectrum of career opportunities in the WAM sector.

3) Financial Incentive Scheme

- To facilitate financial services practitioners to upskill competency and professionalism for career advancement;
- To increase cross-sector mobility.

Overview of Summer Internship Programme (SIP)

- Summary and Feedback (2017-2021) (1)

2017 - 2021

- □ **150**+ Participating Employers ("PE"s) <
- □ **420**+ Summer/Winter interns
- □ **3,200** internship weeks in total
- \Box 6,900+ undergraduates
- \square 110,000+ applications

Our **PEs** told us:

- ✓ SIP provides a large pool of applicants for them to identify good students;
- ✓ the students' qualities meeting their expectations and the positions were filled with the right students; and
- ✓ they are satisfied with the arrangement and support.



Overview of Summer Internship Programme (SIP)

- Summary and Feedback (2017-2021) (2)

Our **Interns** told us:

- 97% of the interns rated their overall internship experience with **positive** feedback;
- 96% of the interns believed the SIP experience provided them with a better understanding of job functions and good preview on career prospects in the WAM sector; and
- 95% of the interns said the programme met their expectations.

Interns found the overall work experience **valuable**.

Summer Internship Programme (SIP)

- Student Eligibility (2)
- Residents of the HKSAR;
- Lawfully employable in the HKSAR;
 - For the undergraduates holding student visa, the following documents are required to present to the employers and HKSI Institute for vetting before internship commencement:
 - 1) Internship arranged <u>during 1 June to 31 August</u>
 - No Objection Letter ("NOL") stating the employment eligibility issued by the Immigration Department
 - 2) Internship arranged out of the period of 1 June to 31 August
 - A new NOL with correct internship period; and
 - an endorsement letter issued by the HEIs stating the relevant internship details



Overview of Summer Internship Programme (SIP) –Eligibility: Employers

Offering internship positions with **WAM-related** work assignments:

1) Financial institutions	 licenced with Securities and Futures Commission ("SFC") under Securities and Futures Ordinance (Cap. 571) to carry out: Type 4 (Advising on securities) regulated activity; or Type 9 (Asset Management) regulated activity. registered with the Hong Kong Monetary Authority.
2) Insurers or insurance intermediaries	licenced under the Insurance Ordinance (Cap. 41).
3) Trust companies	registered under Part 8 of the Trustee Ordinance (Cap. 29).
4) Firms or corporate practices	 registered with the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants ("HKICPA").
5) Trustees	• approved by the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Authority ("MPFA") under the Mandatory Provident Fund Schemes Ordinance (Cap. 485).
6) Trusts or company service providers	 licenced by the Companies Registry under the Anti-Money Laundering and Counter-Terrorist Financing Ordinance (Cap. 615).



Summer Internship Programme (SIP) – SIP 2022





Internship position offered

- Interns will be offered full-time employment with WAM-related work assignments in Hong Kong during summer of 2022;
- Each internship period offered by the PEs will last for a minimum of 4 weeks;
- Interns are allowed to take up more than one internship position provided that:
 - same or different job categories by different PEs; and
 - the internship periods do not overlap; and
- Interns will be entitled to an honorarium paid.



Student Application (1)

- Student application period: 12noon of 8 March to 12noon of 29 March;
- Visit the website of WAM Pilot Programme (<u>www.wamtalent.org.hk</u>) for:
 - Guide for Students (2022)
 - List of PEs and internship positions
 - Online application portal
- 110 PEs offered 377 internship positions in front, middle, back offices or mixed job categories:

- Student Application (2)

Advices to students:

- 1) Read the Guide for Students (2022) thoroughly before application;
- 2) Consider different job categories to widen your exposure;
- 3) Apply for as **many positions** as you wish that match with your career aspiration;
- 4) Review the **job duties** and **requirements** in detail and **tailor** your **information**;
- 5) Prepare curriculum vitae ("CV") **offline** first. Complete an **online application form** and upload the CV/ required documents by the PEs;
- 6) Produce and upload a **video CV** (optional) to your account profile as **additional information** for PEs' consideration;
- 7) Ensure **completeness** and **accuracy** of all the information before submission;
- 8) Submit applications early to avoid network congestion on the last day.



Undergo **six steps** to complete job application:

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1 Eligibility > 2 Application Procedures > 3 Declaration > 4 Application Form > 5 Preview & Confirmation > 6 Finish
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Step 1: Check your eligibility

Step 2: Understand the application procedures

Step 3: Read the Terms and Conditions, Personal Information Collection Statement and submit declaration

Step 4: Fill in the application form with uploading CV and required documents

Step 5: Review and confirm the information prepared

Step 6: Press "Submit" button to send your application



- Selection and Offer

PEs will:

- start to receive student applications from 12noon of 8 March;
- contact the **shortlisted** students **directly** for arranging suitability assessments or other additional administrative procedures as appropriate for compliance purpose;
- have **full discretion** on the selection process and determining the employment terms of the internship; and
- proceed to extend job offers and arrange the employment contract with remuneration details, working hours and other employments terms and conditions complying with all relevant statutory and legal obligations clearly specified for the students to sign.

Students should:

- get prepared and ready for a job interview;
- **follow** the **instructions** of the PEs; and
- accept or decline the offers before the deadline set by respective PEs.



Verification and Readiness Briefing

Prior to commencement of internship, the interns are:

- required to complete a Student Intern (Applicant) Record Form;
- required to attend verification meeting and provide original supporting documents for confirmation on the eligibility;
- invited to attend Readiness Briefing sessions.

Points to note:

- Internships cannot and will not commence unless the HKSI Institute has completed the verification process with respect to the interns;
- A duly completed and signed Student Intern (Applicant) Record Form is required to return to the HKSI Institute for record.
- Students who made false statement or provided wrong information would be put on a "watchlist". The relevant HEI will be informed of such incident(s). There may also be attendant legal consequences.



Internship period

The interns:

- should abide by the terms and conditions of employment and observe all applicable rules, policies, procedures, etc. of the PEs;
- will be assigned with mentors from the PEs to manage, coach and share experience;
- are required to submit the **evaluation** on the internship experience and the overall operations of the SIP; and
- are welcome to contact the HKSI Institute for advice and assistance as necessary.

The HKSI Institute:

- contacts the interns and conducts pulse check via workplace visits, online meetings or calls when deemed necessary;
- follows up any concerned cases with the respective career offices as appropriate.
